Works Oted (MLA)

All of the sources used in a paper must be listed at the end. These should be on a separate page. At the top, type the words Works Oted and center them. Entries should be double spaced and alphabetized. Otations should have a hanging indent (which means that if there is more than one line, the second, third, etc. should be indented).

For sources include:

Lastname, Firstname. Title of Book. Oty of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium of

Publication.

For sources include:

Editor, author, or compiler name (if available). Name of Ste. Name of

institution/organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher), date of resource creation

(if available). Medium of publication. Date of access.

References (APA)

All of the sources used in a paper must be listed at the end. These should be on a separate page. At the top, type the word References and center it. Entries should be double spaced and alphabetized. Otations should have a hanging indent.

For sources include:

Author, A. A. (Year of publication). Title of work: Capital letter also for subtitle. Location: Publisher.

NOTE: For "Location," you should always list the city and the state using the two letter postal abbreviation without periods (New York, NY).

For sources with no DOI include:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). Title of article. Title of Online Periodical, volume

number(issue number if available). Retrieved from http://www.someaddress.com/full/url/

For sources with DOI include:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). Title of article. Title of Journal, volume number, page
